

CONSTITUTION
OF THE
CALIFORNIA NEVADA INTERSCHOLASTIC
SKI AND SNOWBOARD FEDERATION

Article I Name and Purpose

1. This organization shall be known as the California Nevada Interscholastic Ski And Snowboard Federation.
2. The purposes of this organization are:
 - a. To direct and control interscholastic skiing and snowboarding with a special emphasis on safety, sportsmanship, team spirit, and Victory with Honor.
 - b. To administer the sport of interscholastic skiing and snowboarding through rules and regulations as set by the U.S.S.S.A. and the CIF.
 - c. To establish the responsibility for the administration of interscholastic competitive skiing and snowboarding in order to create more cordial and friendly relations among schools.

Article II Jurisdiction

1. This organization is part of the California Interscholastic Federation and operates under the jurisdiction of the Northern Section of that body.
2. Nevada High Schools may be admitted to membership providing they have permission from the Nevada High School Interscholastic Federation.
3. Schools outside the Northern Section C.I.F. may join the CNISSF but the students must observe all eligibility regulations of their CIF Section.

Article III Governing Body

1. The CNISSF governing body shall consist of a school representative from each member school. This group shall be known as the Ski Council.
2. This Ski Council shall meet twice each year in April or May and December. Other meetings may be called by the Chairperson upon ten days notice to member schools. The time and place for the meetings shall be set by the Chairperson and he/she shall send out notices of the meeting to all member schools at least ten days prior to the meeting.

Ski Federation Constitution - Cont'd

3. At its meetings the Ski Council shall:
 - a. Each second year choose a Chairperson
 - b. Recommend to the Northern Section Board of Managers any deletions or additions to membership.
 - c. Make any changes in the CNISSF Constitution or By-Laws.
 - d. Conduct any other business.
4. The Ski Council shall divide the member schools into Divisions in accordance with the By-Laws. Each Division shall elect a Division Coordinator, who will coordinate the activities of the Division with the CNISSF. This is to be done under the direction of the Chairperson of the Ski Council.
6. The Chairperson of the Ski Council shall act in a liaison capacity between the CNISSF, the United States Ski and Snowboard Association, the Far West Ski Association and other groups interested in the advancement of ski activities.
7. Schools entering Nordic activities shall choose Nordic Coordinator(s) who shall represent the Ski Council in planning and conducting Nordic events under the direction of the Ski Council Chairperson.
8. The Chairperson of the Ski Council or his/her appointed representative shall be responsible for the collection and disbursing of all funds as directed by the Ski Council. He/she shall present an annual financial report to the Ski Council.
9. Any recommended changes in the CNISSF Constitution and By-Laws may be made by a majority vote of the Ski Council at any of their meetings.
10. Any vacancies in the offices of the Ski Council shall be filled by the Ski Council at the next regular meeting.
11. The Re-alignment Committee (Division Coordinators) of the Ski Council shall also serve as the Executive Committee.
12. Prior to each interscholastic season, each participating school must forward a list of eligible students to the schools in its division. This list must be signed by the principal or his designated representative.
13. The Chairperson will send an annual report to the principal of each high school after the April or May meeting each year.
